Gain insight into Israeli and Middle Eastern news through discussions, media analysis, and articles to help critically understand daily events and life in the region

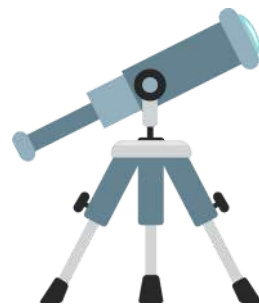

Moments of Happiness: My History With the UW Marching Band

When Mike Leckrone became the director of the Wisconsin Marching Band, interest in the program was low. By creating a new, demanding marching style "stop at the top", a pre-game run on, and the development of the band's "fifth quarter" post-game performances, he emphasized showmanship and turned the program around. Mike will share an overview, including funny anecdotes and stories regarding the evolution of "The Best Band in the Land". He will discuss his history as an educator, leader, and motivator, and explain the journey of development of the UW Spring Band Concert from a modest performance for 400 loyal fans in 1975, to a three night extravaganza drawing in more than 35,000 people
